








Explore, Destroy, Repair: 1910-1919



The second decade of the twentieth century, the 1910s, was a time of exploration. There was also a terrible war during this decade called World War I.



Here are the dates for the timeline figures in your workbook.



1910-1936. King George V. King George V (1865-1936) was king of England during World War I. He reigned for sixteen years.

1911. Sun Yat-sen. Sun Yat-sen (1866-1925), a Christian medical doctor, founded the Kuomintang, or National People's Party and was the first president of the new Republic of China after the Manchu Dynasty was overthrown.





Czar Nicholas II

1894-1917. Reign of Czar Nicholas II. Nicholas II, or Nicholas Alexandrovich Romanov, (1868-1918) reigned during difficult and changing times for Russia. His attempts at reform were too late and he abdicated in 1917.

1911. Amundsen Reaches South Pole. On December 14, 1911 Roald Amundsen (1872-1928), of Norway, and his men reached the South Pole.




1912. Parachutes Invented.



1913. First Assembly Line. Henry Ford introduces the world's first moving assembly line in his factory to make Model T's that are well built and cheap enough for middle-class Americans to afford. Ford brought the time to assemble a car from 12 hours to 2 hours 30 minutes.

1913-1921. Woodrow Wilson. Thomas Woodrow Wilson (1856-1924) was President of the United States from 1913-1921, during World War I. He not only wanted the US government to have more power, but he wanted to create a world-wide government that would have power over sovereign nation. He is famous for his 'Fourteen Points.'






1914. Panama Canal. The Panama Canal, built and paid for by the United States, crossed the Isthmus of Panama so that ships could cross from the Atlantic Ocean to the Pacific Ocean without going around South

America. It took ten years to build and opened in 1914.

1914-1918. World War I. The 'War to End All Wars' or 'The Great War,' World War I claimed the lives of ten million men from 32 different nations.





1915. Edith Cavell. British nurse Edith Cavell, was executed by the German forces occupying Belgium because she helped British prisoners escape from the invading German Army.


1915. Herbert Hoover. While working in London at the outbreak of World War I, Herbert Hoover (1874-1964), who would later be the 31st President of the U.S. had compassion for the starving Belgians under German occupation and started a private charity, Commission for the Relief in Belgium, feeding nine million people a day.





1917. Nikolai Lenin. Vladimir Ilyich Ulyanov, known as Nikolai Lenin, (1870-1924) stirred up the Bolsheviks to destroy the nationalist government in Russia that had overthrown Czar Nicholas II. He ushered in the brutal reign of Communism in Russia and was responsible for killing over five million people.

1917 Balfour Declaration. A note from Foreign Secretary Arthur Balfour to Lord Rothschild promising a Jewish homeland.





Robert Peary Reaches North Pole

Robert wanted to explore the world. When he grew up, he joined the U.S. Navy to see the world. Rear Admiral Robert Edwin Peary (1856-1920) was full of dreams to explore the world. In 1886, when he was thirty-years-old, he took a six-month leave from the Navy to cross Greenland on a dogsled. Unfortunately, he ran out of food after 100 miles and had to turn back.

After he went back to the Navy, Robert was given an interesting assignment. He was sent to Nicaragua to find some possible routes for a canal. Before he left, he shopped for new clothes. He wanted at least one spiffy tropical outfit. His sales clerk was a young black

man and they got to talking. When

Robert found out that Matthew Henson had been a cabin boy for six years, he hired him on the spot as his personal assistant.

While trudging through the hot, steamy jungles of Nicaragua, Robert shared his dream of Arctic exploration with young Matthew. Matthew would accompany Robert on every Arctic expedition.

Just like he bought tropical clothes for Nicaragua, he decided to go native when it came to dressing for the Arctic. He studied the Inuit Indians' ways of dressing, eating, and keeping warm. He learned to build igloos. I wonder what the Native Americans thought of Robert and Matthew asking so many questions.

In 1892, Robert went far enough across Greenland that he was able to climb up a cliff and from the view of a cliff, see that Greenland was an island. Now, it was time to head to the North Pole. A rich friend funded his trip. He bought a ship and put together an exploring party, or group of friends who would go with him. For two years, he struggled to reach the North Pole, but the trip ended with failure. He comforted himself by declaring that he had reached the furthest point north.


In 1909, Robert set out again. On April 6, 1909, Robert Peary and Matthew Henson reached the North Pole.




Many songs were popular during the 1910s. One favorite was "When Irish Eyes are Smiling."

Sinh & Grandpa's Stories

"I know," his grandson laughed. "The Dragon fell in love with a beautiful fairy name Au Co and they had 500 eggs and 30 fines sons."

"100 eggs and 100 fine sons, Number Two" Hue corrected his grandson. "A marriage between a fairy and a dragon just couldn't work. So the Dragon Lord of Lac went far away and Au Co, the beautiful fairy headed to Hanoi with 50 of her fine sons." Sinh and his grandfather lived in Vietnam.

Sinh was called Number Two because he was second to his father, Number One. His younger brothers were called Number Three, Number Four, and Number Five.

"Grandpa, tell me how the brave Vietnamese were freed from the terrible Chinese rulers," Sinh begged his grandfather.

"200 years before our precious Jesus was born, a fierce Chinese general enslaved our people. They built roads and dykes. They taught our people to write. They brought a false religion into our nation called Buddhism. For 1,000 years our people were enslaved by the terrible Chinese oppressors, but finally they rose up and overthrew the enemy!"

"It wasn't because they were stronger. It wasn't because their army was bigger." Sinh practically sang. He knew why the Vietnamese had defeated their Chinese oppressors.

Grandfather paused, and seeing Sinh's puzzled look, continued, "When the enemy is away from home for a long time and there are no victories, but many deaths, the enemy begins to lose heart and become discouraged. Time is always on our side."

"And our mountains and jungles discourage the enemy," Sinh added. He had heard Grandpa ramble many times before.

"It's time for me to go back to work, little one and you need to do your homework." Sinh bowed to his grandfather and watched him put on his straw hat and head back out to the rice paddies to oversee his workers. Sinh attended a French missionary school where he learned about history, writing, reading, math, and how to speak French. His family were devout Roman Catholics, attending the beautiful Notre Dame Cathedral in Saigon. Every Sunday they walked for an hour to the city where they worshipped. His parents and grandfather could speak fluent French, but at home they spoke the language of their people. And, though his grandfather loved their dear French priest, he did not like foreigners running his country.

World War I

Why was Sinh's father fighting for France? I'm glad you asked. He was fighting in World War I for the French because Vietnam was a French colony.

World War I began in 1914 and ended in 1918 when the Central Powers surrendered to the Allies. Austria-Hungry, Germany, Bulgaria, and the Ottoman Empire fought against France, Britain, Japan, Russia, the United States, and a host of other countries.

If you look at this map, you can see the countries in Europe that started the war. Eventually almost the whole world was involved in the fighting.

Allied Powers

The key players on the Allies side were Britain, France, and Russia. Italy, originally sided with Germany, but switched sides during the war. The United States joined the war on the Allies side. Other nations who fought with the Allies were Belgium, Japan, Serbia, Liberia, Portugal, Romania, Brazil, Greece, Siam, Montenegro, Canada, Australia, New Zealand, India, South Africa, and China.

Central Powers World War I

Central Powers

The Central Powers who fought against the Allies were Germany, the Austria-Hungarian Empire, the Ottoman Empire, and Bulgaria. Here are the leaders of those countries.

In World War I, each side would build a large network of trenches where the soldiers would eat, sleep, and try to stay safe from enemy fire. Between the trenches was the battlefield.

Have you ever seen a picture of a tank? Well, tanks were used for the first time in World War I. At first they were very slow.

Airplanes

The brand new airplanes were used for the first time in a war in 1914 at the very beginning of the war.

Hot air balloons and airships called Zeppelins had already been used in other wars to gather information on the enemy and his position. At first planes were just used to gather information about the enemy.

In the beginning enemy pilots just waved to each other, but that changed quickly in August of 1914 when a Serbian pilot waved to an Austria-Hungarian pilot who waved back, but then pulled out a pistol and shot the Serbian pilot. After that, Serbian pilots carried guns on board.

Pilots on reconnaissance, or information-gathering, missions from the opposite sides of the war eventually started to fight with each other.

By late 1915, the Germans were superior to the Allies in the air. At this point, 'ace' pilots began to emerge. It was time for Britain to beef it up and she did, creating planes with guns mounted

that fire forward.

'Ace' pilots were expected to take out reconnaissance pilots and balloons.

Soon reconnaissance pilots had to have fighters onboard to protect the plane. By the end of World War I, there were specialized planes: fighters, bombers, and ground-attack airplanes.

Ace fighter pilots were like the knights of old, heroic and bigger than life.

Flying Aces, or special pilots in World War I became famous. They were looked up to as modern-day knights and enjoyed immense popularity at home. Dog fights became part of fighting in the air.

What is a dog fight?



1917 Dogfights World War I

A dog fight is a battle in the air conducted at close range. By July 1915, pilots were shooting each other down. One British pilot shot down three planes during one sortie, or mission. The fights often took the form of dance between the pilots in the air with swooping and swirling and turning and dodging. Pilots learned to fly their planes in all different directions to avoid a hit.

Here are some of the most famous of the Aces: German pilot Manfred von Richthofen, or the Red

Baron, French pilot Rene Fonck, British flyer William Avery Bishop, and Willy Omer Coppens de Houthulst of Belgium. Even though the United States entered the war so late, her own 'Ace' Edward 'Eddie' Vernon Rickenbacker became famous after only a few months of flying.



The Allies were eventually victorious, but at a high price of lives lost and property destroyed.

Red Baron

Manfred von Richthofen, nicknamed the Red Baron, is considered the best flying ace of World War I with 80 kills. His typical attack was to dive from above with the sun behind him to blind his target.


The Red Baron was shot down on April 21, 1918. His wound was fatal. Souvenir hunters gathered up pieces of his plane.

If you have ever seen Snoopy fighting the Red Baron in the Peanuts® (Charlie Brown) cartoons of Charles Schultz, the Red Baron is based on this Red Baron from World War I.

Eddie Rickenbacker

When he was twelve, Eddie's father died so he helped support his mother. Edward 'Eddie' Vernon Rickenbacker (1890-1973) got a job at a factory making cars. In his lifetime he was a race car driver, a fighter pilot, airline executive, political advisor. Eddie tried car racing after several years of working in the automobile factory. He set a record in one of his Indianapolis 500 races.

When America joined the war effort,



Eddie suggested that the military use race Eddie Rickenbacker and Eddie O'Donnell 1914 Car Racing car drivers as pilots. The military politely

rejected his idea. Eddie joined the army anyway where he worked as a driver and car mechanic. However, a chance meeting with the chief of the Army's Air Service allowed him to enter pilot training.

On April 14, 1918, Eddie flew his first sortie, or air mission. He flew weeks without shooting down an enemy plane and making lots of mistakes that he chose to learn from. Finally, one day he had his first dog-fight and enemy kill. There were many dog-fights and kills to follow.

After the war, Eddie started and worked with airline companies, including Eastern Airlines where he became general manger in 1933 and

president in 1938.

During World War II, he piloted a B-

17 with a seven-member crew on a secret mission for General Douglas MacArthur. I am sorry to tell you that the plane was shot down and the eight men had to ride a raft for 22 days in the middle of the Pacific. One man died and Eddie lost 54 pounds.

In later life, he championed conservative political causes and spoke out against socialism and communism.

"David, I have been reading Isaiah 53 and I was wondering today if Jesus is the Messiah. But, to accept that would be to turn my back on the Jewish people."


"I understand what you are saying. But, Jesus was Jewish."

Israel

I am going to tell you about the Balfour Declaration. The Balfour Declaration was a letter that promised the Jews a homeland in the Middle East.

In your lifetime there is a nation of Israel.

When you read the Bible, there is a nation of Israel.

But for almost 2,000 years there was no nation of Israel and Jews were scattered in countries all over the world.

Theodor Herzl, a famous Jewish writer, wanted a new Jewish state after he wrote an article about the Dreyfus Affair in France. "What was Dreyfus Affair in France," you ask. Well, French soldier Dreyfus was found guilty of treason after fellow soldiers lied about him because he was Jewish. Many people at the time in Europe did not like Jewish people. The anger and lies convinced leaders like Herzl that Jews needed a nation of their own because they would never be safe in Europe.

God gave a Jewish man named Chaim favor with the British leaders. Chaim Weizmann, a Zionist leader, invented a fermentation process to create acetone. The British soldiers needed acetone to make their weapons work.

Because what Chaim did, the British leaders agreed to support a Jewish homeland.

Chaim Weizamn helped Lord Rothschild—head of the English branch of the powerful Jewish banking family— to

write a letter to send to Arthur James Balfour, the Foreign Secretary. Two days later a reply came from Balfour. For Mr. Weizmann, and for every Jew around the world, the reply was filled with a glad promise.


The Baflour Declaration was a 117-word note written by Foreign Secretary Arthur Balfour to Lord Rothschild, head of a famous Jewish banking family. The letter said: 'His Majesty's Government views with favour the establishment in Palestine of a national home for the Jewish people.'

Now the Jewish people had hope that there would be an Israel again. By 1936 more than sixty thousand Jews had moved to Palestine.

The Balfour Declaration was issued on November 2, 1917.

British soldiers conquered Jerusalem and the land of Palestine. Now the hope of a Jewish

nation was very real.

Children loved to play with Erector Sets in the 1910s. An Erector Set was a metal toy construction set that included pulleys, gears, wheels, and electric motors. Alfred Carlton Gilbert created a company, the Mysto Manufacturing Company in New Haven, Connecticut in 1913.

Charlie Pajeau, a stone mason, was watching kids play with spools and sticks when he had an idea. He got his friends Robert Pettit and Gordon Tinker to help him create Tinker Toys, a toy construction set. They established a business called the Toy Tinkers Company in Evanston, Illinois. Children loved to build things with Tinker Toys.

A writer named Johnny Gruell (1880-1938) wrote books about a rag doll named Raggedy Ann with red yarn for hair and a triangle nose. Both the book and the doll were very popular with boys and girls when they were introduced in 1918.

Raggedy Ann dolls remained popular for the entire twentieth century. The little floppy rag doll was toted around in little girls' arms whose grandmothers had toted their own Raggedy Ann dolls around.

Baseball

Boys throughout the twentieth century have loved to watch and play baseball. How about you? Do you like to catch, pitch, throw, and bat?

President William F. Taft served as President of the United States from 1909 to 1913. He began a Presidential tradition. On April 14, 1910, President Taft threw the ceremonial opening ball of the baseball season opener game. Presidents have followed his example and continued the custom into the twenty-first century.

World Series

The first World Series was held in 1903 between the American League champion and the National League champion. That year the Boston Americans played the Pittsburgh Pirates.
